People passing by Melita's Front Street will find something new to look at. Located on the south side of the library, a Canada 150 sign was painted on the wall to commemorate this year's sesquicentennial celebration. The Town of Melita tapped the Melita & Area Art Club and other community volunteers to work on the project. The target completion date was for the painted wall to be done before the Town's Canada 150 kick-off celebration on June 27. Through the concerted effort of the group, the first wall was completed on the evening of June 7th. The second wall being prepared is Super Thrifty's north side along Souris Street.

Town of Melita's support together with the Melita & Area Art Club, Southwest Library Board, Antler River Recreation District, Melita & Area Fire Department, Enns Brothers, and other community volunteers made phase one of this project possible. This project is funded [in part] by the Government of Canada.

Background

A couple of walls were identified around town to commemorate the sesquicentennial celebration. The design was projected onto the wall and traced prior to painting on the colors.
